

Thousands of Schoolchildren Expected to Descend on USF for 39th Engineering EXPO

This year's theme is "Imagine Your Future" for the free K-12 STEM event.

Tampa, Fla. (February 16, 2011) – They're coming from all over the state in 200 school buses – thousands of K-12 students and their teachers to learn how engineering and science play a big part of their everyday lives. This weekend (Feb. 18 – 19, 9-4 p.m.) is the 39th annual Engineering EXPO, a free event open to everyone, young or old, who has an interest in science, technology, engineering and math (STEM).

A student-run organization at USF's College of Engineering, EXPO's primary goal is to introduce students to the STEM fields. Visitors have the opportunity to meet and talk with local engineers and engineering student organizations through hands-on exhibits and shows that encourage more students to pursue fields in science and math.

EXPO exhibits get more extreme each year from laser light shows, boats and robotics building, dry ice demonstrations to the ever-popular experiment that makes 'elephant's toothpaste' and so much more. This year Chevrolet will have five cars on display and ASME's Electrathon team will demonstrate its electric race car and the SAE Pit Stop Challenge.
